	Achillea x huteri	A dense growing, silvery mound with a profusion of pure white flowers in summer.
	Achillea x 'King Edward'	First rate alpine, flowering for ages with soft primrose yellow blooms. Only 4" high.
	Achillea erba-rotta ssp moschata	Alpine species with foliage like fine chamomile and short stems of white flowers in summer.
	Acinos alpinus	Alpine herb forming small mound. Lots purple-pink labiate flrs. in Summer. Dry scree/ sun.
	Aconitum lycoctonum	Excellent woodland plant standing 3' high with lots of creamy yellow Monkshood flowers.
	Agapanthus 'Hedbourne Hybrids'	Reliably hardy hybrid, excellent for Scottish gardens. Blue shades vary slightly.
	Allium cernnum (light pink form)	Excellent rockery variety, only 8" high, with drooping pink umbels in late summer.
	Allium greyeri	Small, well behaved species from the U.S. Soft pink heads on 7" stems. Limited supply.
	Allium insubricum	Very special, slow to reach flwrg. size, dusky pink, thimble sized bells hang from 8" stems.
	Allium macranthum	A dramatic Allium with large purple bells in clusters during June. Height 10". Himalayas.
	Allium sikkimensis	Neat rockery species at only 7" with deep royal blue heads. One of very best for alpine gardens.
	Allium thunbergii	Last alpine to flower on Nursery, at only 6". Round, chunky pink globes, Oct – November.
	Anaphalis triplinervis 'Sommer Schnee'	Beautiful, silvery carpet of silky haired leaves and 4" stems white, Helichrysum-like flowers.
	Androsace carnea 'Brigantica'	Compact 'Thrift like' mound with short stems of white flowers in April. A classy, easy alpine.
	Androsace carnea var laggeri	A very tight cushion of needle thin leaves, free flowering, with rose pink heads.
	Androsace sarmentosa(Summer) (ex wild collection, Himalayas)	Small rosettes form a close mat, each with a stem topped by many deep pink flowers.
	Androsace studiosorum (Avail. Summer)	Large, wooly rosettes topped by red stems with large pink flowers in June. SPECIAL.
	Anemone x seemannii	Beautiful, pale yellow hybrid, between A. ranunculoides and native wood anemone.
	Anemone nemorosa 'Blue Bonnet'	Seldom offered selection, mid blue flowers pre spring. Slow growing special for shade.
	Anemone nemorosa 'Robinsoniana'	One of the largest flwrg. wood Anemones of spring. Lilac-blue blooms well into late April.
	Anemone nemorosa x 'Virescens'	Unusual sport. Ferny green bracts instead of flowers. Very decorative for shaded woodland.
	Anemone palmata lutea	One of many names for A. magellanica. Our form has strong vanilla yellow colour. 10" high
	Anemone rivularis	Plenty of white blooms when few plants have yet reached their peak. Mid summer.

	Anemone sylvestris 'Flore Plena'	Quite a rare item. Flowers so double, they form almost a pom-pom. Groundcover at only 4" ht.
	Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'	A superb combination. Red button flwrs. above silvery mat. Lovely over rocks and gravel.
	Anthemis carpatica 'Karpatenschnee'	A beautiful, silvery filigree mat with white Marguerite daisies. For sun, on large rockery
	Aquilegia buergeriana 'Calimero'	Charming, dwarf species Aquilegia, with chocolate lanterns and cream cup inside. 5"
	Aquilegia caerulea 'Red Hobbit'	Crimson red spurred flowers with a striking white cup. Ht. 10" with several stems per plant.
	Aquilegia chaplinii	A rare species, with fine chocolate coloured leaves and 9" stems with narrow lemon flowers
	Aquilegia flabellata 'Rosea'	A beautiful miniature with soft, baby pink flowers and cream cup. Only 7" high.
	Arabis muralis	Emerald green mound, close to gravel. 6" stems rise with nodding pink flowers.
	Arenaria festucoides	A close, grassy mat from the Himalayas, with short, stemless white flowers.
	Arenaria purpurascens	Close mat of needle-like foliage, peppered with pinky-red, star like flowers during spring.
	Arisaema flavum var abbreviatum	A miniature form, only 4-5" high, with plain green leaves and yellow ochre, hooded spathe.
	Armeria juniperifolia 'Bevan's Form'	Tight dome radiating many deep pink 'Thrift' flrs. over fairly long period. Great trough plant.
	Armeria maritima 'Splendens'	A well-known Thrift for its free flowering habit. Produces lots of deep pink blooms.
	Armeria maritima 'Vesuvius'	New Thrift with hot pink flowers over a long period. Darkest bronzy foliage.
	Astilbe chinensis pumila 'Tiny Form'	Perfect 6" miniature of this species Astilbe, which we have long cultivated. V. uncommon
	Astilbe crispa 'Perkeo'	Variety with very short, stiff leaves and 6" spikes of radiant pink flowers.
	Astilbe simplicifolia 'Sprite'	One of the most popular of dwarf Astilbes, its shell pink blossoms are only 8" high. Stunning.
	Aubretia marginata 'Bressingham Red'	The best red to date of this easy, yet valuable addition to rockery. Flowers in spring.
	Aubretia marginata 'Variegata'	Somewhat rare and special. Only 6" across, with pale blue, repeating flowers. Troughs.
	Aubretia 'Stock Flowered Pink'	Delicate, soft pink flowers on this semi-double rockery classic.
	Berberis corallina 'Compacta'	A rarity, eventually reaching 30" in ten years. Heavily covered in tangerine flowers.
	Calceolaria falklandica	Tough species from that windswept Island. Good size flrs. for carpeting in damp shade.
	Caltha palustris 'Multiplex'	The well-known, fully double form of our native Marsh Marigold. Very low growing.
	Caltha palustris ssp minor	Tiny Marsh Marigold growing as rarity in Scottish Mnts. only 2" high. Likes moisture!
	Campanula cochleariifolia 'Bavaria Blue'	Heavier flowering sport, which also has larger blue thimbles. An easy and tidy little alpine.

	Campanula cochlearifolia 'Summer Pearl'	New double flowered variety, of palest blue colour. Mid summer, likes full sun.
	Campanula collina	A plant of damp turf in Californian Mountains. Carpeter, with deepest blue bells in summer.
	Campanula garganica 'Dickson's Gold'	There couldn't possibly be a better gold leaved alpine! Contrasts well with the sky blue flowers
	Campanula 'Haylodgensis Alba'	Huge, semi-double white flowers over low growing mound. Long flowering period.
	Campanula poscharlayana 'Lisduggan's Variety'	The perfect wall Bellflower, cascading habit. A mass of lilac flowers for ages.
	Campanula pulla	A lush green mound, producing short stems of large violet bells throughout summer.
	Cardamine pentaphylla	Large dissected leaves emerge after a show of pink trumpets, pre spring. 8" high, woodland.
	Cardamine pratensis 'Flora Plena'	Double form of our native Cuckoo flower. Ideal in damp, part shade. Sterile, elegant sport.
	Celmisia coreacea (<i>Avail. Summer</i>)	Silvery, lanceolate leaves and large, white daisies throughout June. Natural leaf variation.
	Celmisia hookeri (<i>Avail. Summer</i>)	The largest flowered species, broad leaves with white reverse. Flowering in July.
	Centaurea incana	Silvery rosettes thread through gravel. Stemless white cornflowers from late May. Uncommon.
	Ceratostigma griffithii	Softly haired foliage on this autumn flowering sub-shrub. Gentian blue flowers, only 9" high.
	Chaenorhinum glareosum	Compact pad of fleshy leaves, short stems of pale lilac flrs over long period. Gritty soil.
	Chaerophyllum hirsutum 'Roseum'	The so-called 'Pink Cow Parsley' for herbaceous borders. Height 3 – 4 ft. Late spring
	Chaiaetophyllum oppositifolium	A well-known alpine with succulent leaves and pendulous Laburnum-like chains.
	Chaiaetophyllum oppositifolium 'Variegatum'	Golden chains of Laburnum like flowers contrast with vivid variegation. Late May. Sun.
	Chrysanthemum 'Haradjanii'	Silvery, fringed foliage, forming open mound 4" high. Small yellow button flowers. Full sun.
	Chrysanthemum weyrichii	G'cover with 7" stems of large pink Chrysanths Showy, seldom seen Japanese alpine. Hardy.
	Chrysosplenium davidii	This is the superior Chinese form with large yellow flowers. Carpeter for woodland.
	Colchicum agrippinum	Rare Turkish species, only 6". Characteristic chequered goblets of dusky rose colour.
	Colchicum speciosum	Autumn wouldn't be the same without the huge pink goblets thrusting through fallen leaves.
	Commelina dianthifolia	Hardy species from high alt. California. Small Tradescantia like flrs. of deepest royal blue. 9"
	Convallaria majalis	Sweetly scented Lily of the Valley for moist shade. Good ground cover for trouble spots.
	Convallaria majalis 'Bordeaux'	The giant Lily of the Valley, with good sized leaves and flowers, and the usual sweet scent.
	Convallaria majalis 'Hardwick Hall'	A robust 'Lily of the Valley' with dark green leaves, edged with cream. Scented flrs. in May.

	Cortusa pekingensis	Dainty pink bells hang, nodding from 7" stems. Like any Primula relative, enjoys moist shade.
	Corydalis solida 'George Baker'	Stock built up over many years of this rarely offered vibrant red hybrid. What colour for Feb!
	Corydalis x 'Heavenly Blue'	Special new hybrid, between C. elata and C. flexuosa. Shorter stems of strong, sky blue flrs.
	Crocsmia 'Solfatere'	Best known of the bronze leaved cultivars. This free flowering old gold variety. Tot. hardy.
	Cyclamen cilicium	Autumn flwrg. and early enough when grown in sheltered woodland or in cold glasshouse.
	Cyclamen cilicium 'Album'	This pure white form is more floriferous than standard pink forms. Starts Oct – Nov.
	Cyclamen coum	Stunning leaf forms on hardy pre-Spring Cyc. Add leaf mould to moist soil. Pink/ white/reds.
	Cyclamen coum 'Silver Leafed'	Uncommon, highly selected, pure silver leaved forms. Most have pink/white edged bi-col. flrs.
	Cyclamen hederifolium 'Silver Cloud'	A special cultivar. Pure silver, unmarked leaves, pink flowers. Looks amazing in shade.
	Cyclamen hederifolium 'White Cloud'	Pure silver leaves, with white flowers in autumn. Dramatic combination for shade.
	Cyclamen intaminatum	Truly miniature, hardy species. Round glossy leaves and small white flrs. Seldom offered.
	Cyclamen mirabile	Autumn flwrg, hardy in sheltered woodland or may be enjoyed in cold glasshouse. Scented.
	Cyclamen purpurascens	Totally hardy, evergreen, summer flwrg. Very special species with scent of Lily of the Valley.
	Cymbalaria hepaticafolia	Rarely seen, with its marbled, leathery leaves, studded with cream, stemless flowers.
	Dactylorhiza fuchsii	Our native spotted Orchid, so easy to please. Flowering almost anywhere in the garden.
	Dianthus arenarius 'Little Maiden' (<i>Avail. Summer</i>)	Small compact cushion, ideal for troughs, etc. Short sprays white, ragged edged, fragrant flrs.
	Dianthus 'Bombardier'	Lovely, short variety with blue foliage and heavily scented crimson flowers.
	Dianthus 'Freda Woodliffe'	Uncommon, new hybrid with blue foliage and 4" stems of single, stark pink, scented flowers.
	Dianthus 'La Bourboule'	Close hummock of blue-green leaves with short stems of highly fragrant pink flowers.
	Dianthus alpinus 'Inshriach Dazzler'	Well named rockery Pink, with most vivid shade of deep pink flowers.
	Dianthus erinacaus alpinus	The 'Hedgehog' Dianthus, forming a close, prickly cushion with short stems of pink flrs.
	Dianthus pavonius	A classy, high alpine mound. Tiny leaves and large pink flowers.
	Disporum flavum	Very rare. Large cream lockets, similar to Dicentra. Orange berries Autumn. Peat bed. 16"
	Disporum smilicium 'Flora Plena'	Very rare sport - took us many years to build stocks of. Small cream flrs, double row petals.
	Disporum smilicium 'Variegata'	Elegant, slender leaves delicately striped with white. Green and white bells in spring.
	Draba aizoides	An easy and very early spring time alpine. Neat mound, sprays of bright yellow flrs. Feb-Mar.

	Draba bruniifolia	Beautiful, dense cushions of emerald green, with golden flowers, pre-spring.
	Dracocephalum botryoides	Really beautiful and delicate, true alpine. Softly haired leaves, close mat, long display lilac flrs.
	Dryas x suendermannii	German hybrid with large white flowers, grown for its floriferous habit and ease of cultivation.
	Erigeron auranticus	Emerald green, glossy leaves and stout stems of bright orange daisies.
	Erigeron glaucus 'Sea Breeze'	Superb rockery/wall plant forming a mound of long-lasting, deep pink daisies. Hardy variety.
	Erigeron montanensis	Long succession of lilac daisies held stemless above softly haired leaves. Easy, very showy.
	Erinus alpinus (sold as mix of colours)	The well-known 'Fairy Foxglove' for crevices and walls. White to rose colours available.
	Erodium variable 'Roseum'	Excellent trough plant, flowering for ages at ground level, throughout the season.
	Erysimum helveticum	Dwarf yellow Wallflower from Switzerland. Approx. 8" high, flowering for ages.
	Felicia rosulata	Hardy Himalayan species. Cornflower blue flowers with orange centres.
	Festuca punctoria	Fantastic little blue miniature for troughs, etc. Very stiff, broader than usual leaves. 3" high.
	Festuca scoparia	Tiny, needle thin alpine variety, excellent for rockery. Lush green colour. 2"
	Fillipendula palmata Dwarf Form	Ideal woodland or front of border plant. Pink flowers, approx. 9" in height.
	Fritillaria camschatensis Dwarf Form	Rarely offered, relic from Jack Drake alpine nsy. Japanese alpine, 9" high. Black flowers.
	Gaultheria itoana <i>Limited supply</i>	Dwarf ericaceous shrublet. Large white berries on low, spreading stems during Aut. Part shade.
	Gentiana acaulis 'Krumrey'	SPECIAL. A very free-flowering form from Germany. Large, deep blue flowers from May.
	Gentiana acaulis 'Maximus'	Absolutely huge, deep blue trumpets on this reliable flowering cultivar. Very rare.
	Geranium cinereum 'Lawrence Flatman'	Purplish pink flowers with dark veins over a long period. Deserves more attention.
	Geranium cinereum 'Purple Pillow'	Strikingly dark, matched by darker foliage, also with a purplish cast. One of the best varieties.
	Geranium dalmaticum 'Album'	Very special, slow to produce. Remains small with good sized white flowers.
	Geranium dalmaticum 'Croftlea'	We're first to promote and propagate this free flowering, carpeting form, given by D. Hutton.
	Geranium macrorrhizum 'Snow Sprite'	Low, compact carpet, not too vigorous. Long display snow white flowers. Approx. 7"x 12"
	Geranium orientalitibeticum	A natural variegation to foliage. Dusky pink flrs. late summer. Good groundcover, ht. 3"
	Geranium renardii	Round, sage like leaves, and 6" stems of large cream flrs, deeply veined in grey. Himalayas.
	Geranium sanguineum 'Striatum'	Very compact, free flowering in shade of soft, light pink. Easy Geranium for almost any soil.
	Geranium cinereum subcaulescens (species)	The standard form as seen in European Alps. Magenta flowers with dark central zone.

	Geum rivale 'Dolly North'	A moisture lover, this form of the 'Water Avens' is miniature. Apricot bells on 6" stems.
	Gunnera magellanica	Very useful, hardy ground cover for moist path edges or banks. Winter dormant, only 2" high.
	Gypsophila aretioides	For alpine house or sunny trough. Forms iron hard cushion, very slow growing. SPECIAL.
	Gypsophila cerastoides	Close mat, hidden by the abundant white flowers. Makes a good trough plant.
	Gypsophila cerastoides 'Rosy stripe'	Collected in China not so long ago, much slower growing with white fls, pink veining.
	Gypsophila repens (White)	The white form, as found throughout the European Alps. Cascading sprays in summer.
	Gypsophila repens 'Rosea'	Reliable, cascading alpine for providing sheets of light pink flowers all summer.
	Gypsophila tenuifolius	Excellent trough plant. Close grass-like cushion with many pale pink flowers in spring. Easy.
	Haberlea rhodopensis	Special alpine for north facing, full shade. Plant between rocks at angle. Mauve flrs. in spring.
	Hebe popplewellii	Small, bronzy globe of a shrub, dense growth forming a ball, some 4" x 6". Uncommon.
	Hepatica nobilis Alba	Pure white form of this popular, early spring woodlander. Flowers above unmarked leaves.
	Hepatica nobilis (Dusky Pink)	Selected for its soft lilac/pink shade, a welcome colour break so early in the Spring.
	Hepatica nobilis 'Pyrenean Marbles'	Stunning, large white flowers above Cyclamen-like, marbled fol. Last of the nobilis to flower.
	Hepatica transsilvanica	This species in standard shade, soft cornflower blue with good size flrs, larger than H nobilis.
	Heuchera pulchella	Dainty mound producing many red stems of soft pink flowers. High regions of Rocky Mts.
	Hieraceum villosum	Silver haired leaves emerge as a neat clump, with lots of large, golden daisies early summer.
	Hosta 'Golden Tiara'	Striking, gold variegation on this neat, small Hosta with deep mauve flowers. A.G.M.
	Hylomecon japonicum	Japanese woodland poppy with large yellow flowers in April.
	Hypericum cerastoides	Classy Turkish species forming mats with huge lemon blooms and silvery grey foliage.
	Hypericum reptans	Prostrate mat of tiny, Thyme-like fol. and unnaturally large yellow flowers. Himalayas.
	Hypsela reniformis (Avail. Summer)	Little carpeter for gravelly path edges or scree, from Chile. Stemless, pink Lobelia-like flowers.
	Impatiens omiense	Truly hardy, ground covering species with attractive foliage and lots of large yellow flwrs.
	Incarvillea delavayii 'Snow Top'	The pure white form, with a yellow eye, flowering from June – July. Full sun.
	Incarvillea mairei 'Grandiflora'	The true plant, with ground hugging foliage and 6" stems of gigantic rose pink flowers.
	Inula orientalis 'Grandiflora'	A neat woodlander from Himalayas, only 10" high, with large, orange Calendula-like flowers.
	Iris forrestii Black Form	A rare species, of vastly slower growing habit. Blackish-purple blooms. Forms small clump.

	Iris humilis	The smallest Iris we grow – only 3” high. Has canary yellow flowers. Ideal trough plant.
	Iris innominata Dwarf Form	A cream flowered seedling, selected on the nursery, with delicate, pink veining. 6” high.
	Iris pumila ‘Brassie’	Good rockery bearded Iris, with brassy gold coloured flowers. Approx. 8” high.
	Iris pumila ‘Cherry Garden’	For those who like dark flowers, this 8” Iris has large, aubergine coloured blooms in spring.
	Iris pumila ‘The Gingerbread Man’	Very rare dwarf bearded Iris. Brown flrs, violet beard. Never normally offered wholesale!
	Iris pumila ‘Knick-knack’	A rare and sought after hybrid. White flowers with a violet picotee edge to the petals.
	Iris reticulata ‘Katherine Hodgkin’ (2 bulbs)	In previous years, almost flowering before the season starts! Really lovely little plant.
	Iris suavaolens	Tiny species from the Caucasus. Brass coloured, bearded Iris flowers, only 3” high.
	Iris setosa Dwarf form	Easy dwarf Iris for relatively moist soil. This form approx. 8” Blue flowers, gold veining.
	Leontopodium alpinum ‘Matterhorn’	A new cultivar. Slender, silvery leaves, neat habit. Short stems of narrow petalled flowers.
	Leontopodium soulei ‘Mignon’	Close, mat forming sport of the curious looking Eidelweiss.
	Leucojum aestivum ‘Gravetye Giant’	Bold clump of strap leaves, topped with good sized Snowdrop like bells in late spring.
	Leucojum vernum	Giant snowdrop relative. 8” stems topped by huge white bells from February.
	Lewisia cotyledon hybrids	Stunning vibrant colours - orange to pink. Even some semi-dbl. flwr on this ‘Rainbow’ strain
	Lewisia cotyledon x ‘Little Plum’	German hybrid, of hardy constitution. Lovely, pale raspberry colour flrs. over a long period.
	Limonium speciosum ‘Blue Diamond’	An alpine Statice for raised beds in sun. 8” papery flowers of pale violet. Evergreen foliage
	Lithodora diffusa ‘Heavenly Blue’	Few alpines exhibit such a deep blue colour of flowers. Stunning when seen as a wide mat.
	Lunaria rediviva	Unfortunately, seldom seen. Long lived, early flowering with fragrant white blooms. 3’ high.
	Lysimachia japonica minutissima	Seldom seen Japanese miniature. Low cushion studded with tiny yellow flrs. late summer-aut.
	Lychnis arkwrightii ‘Vesuvius’	Short growing variety. Plum coloured leaves and stunning, vibrant orange flowers. 7” height.
	Maianthemum bifolium	Dwarf woodland ‘May Lily’ white flwr. spikes, and small Hosta-like leaves. Rare U.K. native.
	Maianthemum bifolium var Yakushimanum	Slow, tiny species from Japan for carpeting troughs and shady areas under shrubs.
	Mazus reptans ‘Albus’	A dense carpeter for sunny, gravelly sites. Covered in white, stemless Lobelia flowers.
	Mimulus x burnettii	The hardest of all Mimulus. Long lived hybrid, with hot orange blooms all summer. Special.
	Minuartia circassica (Avail. Summer)	Compact cushion of olive green, with needle thin leaves and short sprays white flwrs. RARE
	Minuartia juniperina	Low mat of needle thin leaves ending in short sprays, each clasping many small white flowers

	Myrtus nummularia	Rare, prostrate native of Falkland Isles. Large, edible pink berries- aut. The only hardy Myrtle.
	Narcissus poeticus ‘Plenus’	The last daffodil to flower. White, double Gardenia blooms with exquisite scent. Special.
	Omphalodes verna ‘Alba’	Woodland groundcover, flowering earliest spring, with plenty white ‘Forget-me-nots’.
	Oxalis adenophylla	Popular ‘Silver Shamrock’. Huge stemless pink funnel shaped flowers over a silvery mat.
	Oxalis depressa	Lovely, deep pink, yellow eyed flowers emerge through gravel. Spreads gently, not invasively.
	Oxalis enneaphylla ‘Waverley Hybrid’	Small impressive hybrid, ideal for troughs. Dark purple, magenta veined flrs. Very special.
	Oxalis minutaefolia	Small hummock, forming stemless, palest pink large flowers. Seldom seen beauty.
	Papaver alpinum	Tiny alpine Poppy of European Alps. Ideal in poor, gritty scree/gravel paths. Mixed colours.
	Parahebe linifolia ‘Blue Skies’	Small, emerald green globe covered in short spikes of pale blue, good sized flowers.
	Penstemon hetrophyllus ‘Blue Gem’	Non-invasive carpeter, producing many short spikes of deep blue flrs. late May-July. Classy.
	Penstemon menziesii Microphyllus (Avail. Summer)	Compact, dome forming shrublet. Lg. sky blue flrs. off and on in spring. 3” x 8” Seldom seen.

- Auricula 'Late Romantic'*** R The latest flowering Auricula we have ever seen. Short stalks of pale peach, rose-like blooms with delicate scent. Late May and repeating late summer.
- Auricula 'Cameo'*** R Good sized, creamy-buff colour on strong, 4" stems. A heavy flowering cultivar, which ages to a violet edge.
- Auricula 'Black Jack'*** R Double mahogany red flowers, held on very short stems close to dish of silvery powdered leaves. Our first double hybrid.
- Primula 'Kusum Krishna'*** A unique plant for quality. Large, deep indigo, scented blooms above round, wavy edged leaves, piped in silvery powder. Now a firm favourite with the alpine enthusiasts.
